


## Cumulative COVID-19 Data for Ross County Cases as of January 21, 2021

#### COVID-19 Vaccine Schedule

Ohio has established a unified approach to Phase 1B, meaning that all vaccine providers should follow the tentative eligibility timeline below. When a new group begins, vaccinations may not be complete for the previous group. It will take a number of weeks to vaccinate age-eligible populations given the limited doses available. The following start dates are subject to change:

- The week of Jan. 19: Ohioans 80 years of age and older.
- The week of Jan. 25: Ohioans 75 years of age and older; those with a developmental or intellectual disability AND specific severe congenital or developmental disorders listed above. (Must have both.)
- The week of Feb. 1: Ohioans 70 years of age and older; employees of K-12 schools with in-person or hybrid education models.
- The week of Feb. 8: Ohioans 65 years of age and older.
- The week of Feb. 15: Those with specific severe congenital or developmental disorders listed on page 1.

### \*\*COVID-19 Vaccine Update\*\*

As of Today, Friday, January 22, Ross County has started 2,569 vaccines and has started on second doses for those in phase 1A. We have been receiving and administering the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine – a two dose vaccine with 28 days between doses. We are NOT holding back any vaccine. Our goal is to administer all of the vaccine we are given using the guidelines set by the State of Ohio. Right now, that means working through those who are 80 years old and above.

We are ONLY scheduling appointments for the vaccine that we receive at our office. If you registered with RCHD you will receive a call from us but, it may be a while because of limited vaccine supplies. You can register with one of our area partners as they may be able to give you an appointment before we can. But know that everyone is working through the same priority group of individuals. If you are scheduled with another provider, please call us to let us know. That way you will not get another call. At this time, RCHD has scheduled all appointments that we can due to our current vaccine allotment.

Next week (1/25), we can begin to schedule those who are age 75 years and older; those with a developmental or intellectual disability AND one of the following conditions: cerebral palsy; spina bifida; severe congenital heart disease requiring hospitalization within the past year; severe type 1 diabetes requiring hospitalization within the past year; inherited metabolic disorders including phenylketonuria; severe neurological disorders including epilepsy, hydrocephaly, and microcephaly; severe genetic disorders including Down syndrome, fragile X syndrome, Prader-Willi syndrome, Turner syndrome, and muscular dystrophy; severe lung disease, including asthma requiring hospitalization within the past year, and cystic fibrosis; sickle cell anemia; and alpha and beta thalassemia; and solid organ transplant patients. If you have a developmental or intellectual disability and believe you fit into this category, contact the Ross County Board of Developmental Disabilities. Those who are 75 years of age and older will receive a phone call when vaccine is available for them.

If you are a school employee, contact your school administration for vaccine information.

Even with the tiered approach, vaccine supplies are extremely limited. Although you may have registered, you may not be to receive the vaccine in the beginning weeks of Phase 1B. As vaccine becomes available, we will move through the priority groups. Please be patient, you will be contacted about the vaccine when we have one available for you.
